



Wildlife Habitat

Large, unbroken natural areas are critical to the survival of many species – especially large mammals like moose, bear, and bobcat. Our native wildlife are challenged by the endless search for food, water and shelter – all of which are in increasingly short supply. When habitat is broken up by roads, utility lines or other physical alteration, it results in smaller spaces for animals to function. Keeping large, unbroken forested areas intact helps keep animals in the wild – where they belong – and out of backyard bird feeders and garbage cans.
